What is different about High School Sailing? Not Funded By The Public Schools

Sailing is underwritten by a local community sailing program or a yacht club. Public schools do not fund sailing programs in NC.

Parents drive the program financing and coaches lead the team. HCS has a 501(3)c for scholarships and fundraising.

Just like sailing camp, some parents can pay and others may need a scholarship. HCS has scholarship channels but needs more. *If your child needs a scholarship - you may need to find your own sponsor.*

HCS Provides Infrastructure

Parents pay for instruction & travel

Boats / Coach Boats: you don't have to buy your kid a boat or own or maintain a coach boat

Committee Boat: 48' Deadrise powerboat for spectator and race committee at home regattas

Facility: HCS covers overhead of the sailing center in Buxton to store boats, host practice, regattas, and scrimmages

Insurance: HCS maintains the fleet insurance and liability insurance for the program

Coaches: Parents pay for instructional hours but HCS covers the overhead of year round full time coaching staff

Yacht Club Membership: A community sailing program like HCS means low membership fees (\$50 annually) vs. costly yacht club memberships

How Many Sailors Make A Program?

Just one team of two sailors would be enough for a pilot year program. **US Sailing sets a maximum sailor to coach ratio at 8:1.** All financial considerations are based on six sailors but 8 can participate with just one coach. If more sailors are interested, Meg Phillips can step in as an assistant coach.

If fewer than 6 sailors sign up, HCS has a sponsor pledged to make up the difference in the cost of the instructional time. Travel costs are scalable to the number of sailors.

What about other NC Programs?



Wrightsville Beach/Wilmington and the Raleigh Triangle Park area have active high school sailing programs. HCS referenced both of these programs to put the program together → Costs, schedule, and expectations are similar with these other NC programs.

What About Scholarships? How to get financial help
